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MOHS SURGERY WOUND CARE INSTRUCTIONS



- 1. Leave bandage on for 24-hours. You may shower the day after surgery.
- 2. If sutures are present gently clean the area with a Q-tip dipped in 3% Hydrogen Peroxide solution. If sutures are not present clean the area with cool water only. If a scab forms you may leave it intact.
- 3. Dry the area with a cloth. Apply a generous layer of <u>Bactroban ointment</u>, (also called <u>Mupirocin ointment</u>) and cover it with Telfa pad or a band-aid. This process should be repeated twice daily until healed.
- 4. If bleeding occurs, apply firm pressure to the area with gauze for twenty minutes. If bleeding persists, call our office at (631) 666-2900; after office hours Dr. Coven may be reached directly on his cell phone at (631) 681-3331. If you are unable to call, go directly to your nearest emergency room.
- 5. You may shower the day after surgery. The bandage may get wet in the shower. Change the bandage and dressing to a dry dressing immediately after showering.
- 6. You may take Tylenol as needed for pain (unless instructed otherwise by your physician).
- 7. To prevent excessive swelling to the facial area, you may apply an ice pack (wrapped in a thin towel) for 10 minutes at a time for the first 24 hours,
- 8. If you had facial surgery, it is advised that you sleep in a semi-reclined position. Use a recliner chair or 2-3 pillows for the first night following surgery.
- 9. Please make sure you have an appointment scheduled before you leave the office to have your sutures removed (typically 7-14 days following your surgery). Dr. Coven will tell you the exact day when sutures will need to be removed.
